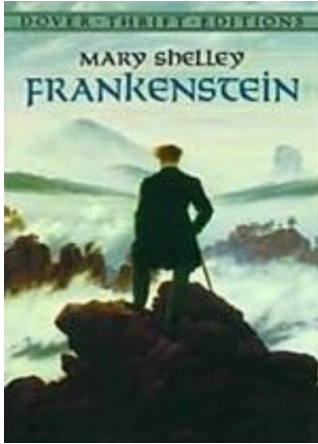


## CP 12th Grade Summer Reading ~ British Literature
